

Over 160 dentists (around 935 total volunteers) performed 8,423 total procedures (including: 2,159 extractions, 697 fillings, 389 cleanings, 108 partial dentures, and 56 root canals) over the two days. Mathew, 1975-2015

We all learn from our mistakes. In dentistry, that usually transitions to either getting better immediately with that particular procedure or referring to someone who can do a better job. If this has never happened to you, then I would have to say that you have never worked on a live patient.

Often we are challenged by the difficulty of a patient who can make even the simplest of procedures challenging. Those of us who practice full time encounter fear and phobias on a daily basis.

But what about the patient that has daily mental challenges?

It was over 25 years ago when Mathew's family brought him to see me. Mathew was a tall, active teenager, tall beyond his years. However, Mathew's mind was to be forever about nine years old. He also had muscular dystrophy.

Mathew would come on a regular basis, every six months, and I dreaded his visits. He could be a challenge. He grew to be a strapping young man of over six feet a zillion, and towered over me and my staff. Many times he did not want to be there because he was usually missing his favorite cartoon. He would let me know that he could break me into several pieces if he wanted to and there is no doubt in my mind that he could do that. But with a little joking and coaxing, he would always settle down.

As the years flowed by, Mathew became more at ease with our appointments. It was always a little strange to have a conversation with this giant of a man about a new toy he had just acquired. We did this almost every visit and then it was okay to proceed with what we needed to do. He became a good patient. We were friends.

It was with sadness when in the last couple of years I watched as his father helped him into my dental chair as his muscular disease was becoming more advanced. His voice was becoming weak but he would still show me his latest toy or small video game before starting with the dental procedure that was planned.

Eventually, Mathew's dad called the office to let us know that he would probably not be able to come to any more dental appointments as he had been placed on a respirator with a tracheotomy to aid in his breathing. It took me a few weeks to go see Mathew in the hospital. I finally went because, frankly, I needed to see him. When I entered the hospital room he was alone in a large semi-reclining hospital wheelchair watching television. When he saw me he couldn't speak but instead reached over and picked up his toothbrush and showed me where the OT had wrapped tape around the handle to fatten it up so that he could grip it better. He was proud of that. I noticed he was watching an old Tom and Jerry cartoon and commented that I had watched that same one when I was a kid. And for the first time I can ever remember, he smiled at me.

What did I learn from Mathew? I learned more about the meaning of empathy. I am not strong in that department, but because of him, I am definitely better. I learned the patience of listening. Mathew was not always very clear in expressing his dental issue, just like some of my patients that do not have his handicaps. Careful listening cannot only reveal a patient's dental problem, but sometimes reveals a host of issues both within and outside the scope of dentistry. I also learned that in order to achieve a consistent degree of dental success takes concerned persistence by the parents or guardians to reinforce good home care and timely dental appointments. And finally, I gained a deep contentment knowing that chronic dental problems was not one of his life problems.

Let me encourage you to treat at least some of the Mathew's in your community. Your expertise is in need. Don't let a fulfilling and worthwhile association slip away.

Because you see, I believe that some of the best and most beautiful things of this world can't be seen or touched. They must be felt by the heart.

It is with great happiness and pride in my association that this issue of the *LDA Journal* highlights the many volunteers who year end and year out support Dental Lifeline Network, as well as the dedicated volunteers and staff who made the LA Mission of Mercy happen in February. Over \$1 million in dental care was performed in two days. Thank you. Thank you all for your service.

The Google Guarantee: Too Good To Be True?

On a weekly basis, our dental clients receive numerous emails from random marketing firms with the latest Google ranking guarantee. The email usually "baits" our clients by pointing out a keyword that is currently not ranked on the first page of Google. The email then proceeds to guarantee a first page ranking on this keyword with a certain time period. These types of emails have increased dramatically as search engine marketing has become an integral piece of the overall marketing strategy for many dental practices.

In crowded sectors like the dentistry field, any opportunity to gain a competitive advantage may be worth your attention; especially one that involves owning precious real estate via Google. According to a recent study by Google, one in every twenty searches on Google is health-related. This is a pretty significant percentage considering there are nearly 5.9 million searches performed daily around the world.

As an increasing number of patients search the web for information regarding their dental health, ensuring that your practice owns a portion of the local real estate on the first page of Google has quickly transformed from a luxury to a necessity.

As tempting as these Google guarantees may be, they are extremely deceitful and are not to be trusted. While the list is endless of why your dental practice should not invest time and attention into these types of scams, I have listed three of the main reasons.

No one can guarantee rankings on Google — On Google's website, their guidelines clearly state: "No one can guarantee rankings on Google." If Google itself is letting the world know that there are no guarantees in rankings, how is anyone outside the organization making these aggressive claims?

Rankings are unstable — According to moz. com, Google changes its algorithm between 500-600 times per year, so the factors influencing first page rankings fluctuate often. There are also over two-hundred indicators that are factored into an organic ranking, and many of these factors cannot be controlled. If many of the ranking factors fall outside the control of these companies, how are they able to guarantee results?

There are NO shortcuts with a successful search strategy — Search Engine Optimization is a marathon, not a sprint. First page rankings cannot be achieved in hours. Ranking ten keywords in ten days is a fabrication. And, the first page or it's free guarantee is a tall tale. If something sounds like it is too good to be true, it probably is.

A good search engine marketing strategy takes time and creativity. It also requires a much richer understanding of your dental practice; one that cannot be obtained through a random email. Resist the temptation to work with any of these firms making phony promises, because the only guarantee will be one of regret.







My Swan Song as LDA President

My year as president is rapidly coming to a close as I'll pass the gavel to Dr. King Scott at the House of Delegates in April. I thought I'd share with you a few thoughts from the past year that stand out for me.

The Louisiana Mission of Mercy (LaMOM) event has to top the list as the most rewarding part of the year. The sheer magnitude of preparation and the number of volunteers who put in countless hours really made me proud of my association and my peer dental professionals. As I have said, the sight of patients crying tears of joy as they left will never leave me, but being able to work with so many dedicated individuals was like being able to perform with a symphony of world class musicians. I thank all of you for letting me play along.

Behind every great man, is a great woman. Until you get here, you have no idea just how much time this job requires. Since we all live with a full dance card already, that time must be stolen from somewhere else. Through all the difficult navigations this year, my wife Sally has been there to listen, to help with patients, and to encourage.

To function as president, you quickly realize that it truly takes a village...our LDA staff is not only flawless in their delivery, but never refuses when asked to do more. With the addition of the LaMOM project, we stretched them, but also learned where additional help will be needed going forward because there's only so many hours in a day. Be assured though that each of them has a forte, and that together as a group they shine.

The LDA/LSBD task force probably has been the most trying part of my year. As president, I received the calls and e-mails from members with complaints and concerns. Cries of foul play, unfair practices and accusations of abuse arose from both LDA members and politicians. Combine that with world class egos on both sides, some misinterpretation of facts, and an emotional conviction of protectionism, and finding middle ground was sometimes difficult.

The Legislature generally has the ultimate say on LSBD's policies. Even State Board rules that they can promulgate on their own without a bill are subject to oversight by certain legislative committees. Since it is unethical for State Board members to lobby legislators, that task falls to the LDA. To ensure the LDA handles that responsibility properly, ideas about issues concerning dentistry and the State Board typically are discussed first in small groups – task forces, both boards, or LDA Councils. These different bodies can and do sometimes disagree on solutions. Ultimately, the LDA House of Delegates has the final say on policy and what bills

the LDA will seek to file in the Legislature. It's rarely an easy process, but the vast majority of the time, it ends up serving both the public and dentists well.

There is more work to be done, though. Conflicts that arose in the 2014 legislature still need to be resolved. It may well be that policies will need to be decided on that will address such things as frivolous law suits against LSBD members and mistakes made in State Board prosecutions that are ultimately paid for by other dentists (through higher fees). How should these be handled? A large number of complaints I've heard involve the process of disciplining dentists. These come from not only the members, but attorneys with firsthand experience, as well as politicians who have their own firsthand knowledge. Are there viable ways to improve that process? The Task Force has also looked at advertising rules. For instance, there is no laser dental specialty, so I cannot advertise that I am a laser specialist - that is absolute. However, if I have received the proper training in lasers, implants, etc., it would certainly seem that there ought to be SOME way I can inform the public I've had that training that wouldn't confuse or mislead. That is open for discussion, and the difficulty in drawing a solid line that applies in all circumstances is why these types of advertising issues seem inherently subjective. But, I also believe it is the subjectivity of some advertising rules that leads to a substantial number of the complaints from the members about the LSBD. The LDA-LSBD Task Force is an initial forum for discussing precisely these kinds of issues.

As you can imagine, there has also been extensive discussion about the relocation of the LSBD to Baton Rouge. The LDA Board has agreed to amend the law to make the move effective August 31, 2019, because the current effective date of January 1, 2017, would cause the LSBD to break their lease. That would result in substantial additional expense. It is my hope that this collaborative process between LDA and LSBD will continue, and that resolution of these types of challenges can be achieved. We have been making progress; it's slow, but it IS progress.

So, as my year comes to a close, I reflect fondly (and with some exhaustion) on the time I have spent serving my profession. I have had many fine mentors all over the state, and look forward to having a scotch with them in the future while talking about fishing in Grand Isle. The future leaders you have chosen, I assure you, will do an excellent job for you. For me, I look forward to wearing my past president pin, and hopefully, if they let me in, having breakfast with those old mentors each year at the Past Presidents' Breakfast prior to the LDA House. I hope they'll let me in the club!

What, in your opinion, are the most critical issues facing dentists right now, and how would you like the LDA to respond to these issues?



LaMOM 2015 Treats Almost 1,500 Patients with Over a \$1 Million Worth of Dental Care

The week started out as normal at the Armed Forces Reserve Center in Baton Rouge with military personnel working on drills, repairing equipment and handling paperwork. However, on Thursday, Feb. 26 and as part of the LDA Foundation, dentists from around the state, LDA staff and general volunteers took over the facility and turned it into an 80 plus chair charity dental clinic. The transformation was incredible!

When the gate opened at 4 a.m. on both February 27 and 28, patients were ready to enter and get in line to begin their much needed dental care. Both mornings, we reached our maximum amount of patients long before lunch. Many patients entered with rotten and obviously decayed teeth and a great deal of pain. That changed as they left smiling, sometimes with gauze still in their mouths, but still smiling!

There are too many volunteers to list them all but if you volunteered you probably have a new appreciation for your association and the incredible leadership team that put together this event. Over 160 dentists (around 935 total volunteers) performed 8,423 total procedures (including: 2,159 extractions, 697 fillings, 389 cleanings, 108 partial dentures, and 56 root canals) over the two days. Over \$1 million in total dental care was provided via 1,473 patient visits (patient ages from 1-94).



As I interviewed patients for a video that will be shared in the near future with members and sponsors, there were many times that tears of joy were shared between dentists and patients as we talked about this life-changing event. Shirley, who will be featured in the

video, found out about the event through her local food bank in New Orleans and came because she'd had missing front teeth for 15 years and pain in several other teeth. She said she received her Christmas wish that day; she now has two front teeth after Dr. Gizelle Richard and Dr. Mike Maginnis fitted her and made her partial denture. If you watch the video, you will see her beautiful new smile.

Another patient, Thomas, shared with us that he had an interview the following Monday for a shift manager at Smoothie King and felt that he had so much confidence already because of his new front teeth. Time-after-time I was told how



much these dentists were appreciated for closing their own practices and bringing staff to work in the Louisiana Mission of Mercy (LaMOM) clinic. There is no doubt that we were

all appreciated and the stories from patients is what made the long hours and hard work worth it.

Putting together LaMOM for the first time on our own was a huge feat led by Dr. Maria Burmaster as the state chair and Drs. Chip Simon and John Portwood as local chairs. Together with the LDA staff and a host of other leaders, along with support from the Irene W. and C.B. Pennington Foundation (our Platinum sponsor), the LSU School of Dentistry and America's Dentists Care Foundation, it was a great success. (We are so thankful for all of our grants, sponsorships and in-kind donations. Please see the entire list on pages 22-24.)

LDA President Dr. Nelson Daly posted this on his personal Facebook page after the event was over: "This has been by far the finest part of my year as LDA president. Patients were crying tears of happiness when they left us, and all were incredibly thankful. Dr. Maria Burmaster, Dr. Chip Simon, and Dr. John Portwood did a masterful job of organizing all of us, the Louisiana Army National Guard were champs for letting us use their facilities and the LDA staff were flawless as usual in creating a seamless event. Please check out all the sponsors who gave us their time and money to pull this off. Sincere thanks to all of you who made this happen. If you missed it, you really missed out on an opportunity to do something fantastic. Hopefully I will see you in New Orleans in 2016!"

Dentist Retires with \$8 Million Fortune at 65

O k, this is not a real headline, but is it possible? Yes it is. Recently, Ronald Read, a Vermont gas station attendant and janitor, surprised the world after he passed away at age 92 for having amassed an \$8 million fortune and then bequeathing the majority of it to a local hospital and library. We can all agree that a dentist will earn more than twice what a janitor will make over a lifetime. Some of the details of Mr. Read's life have surfaced, so how did he amass such a fortune? Here are 5 lessons that a dentist can learn from a retired multi-millionaire janitor:

1. It can pay to be frugal. Mr. Read was known for being quiet and frugal. No one knew he was rich. He lived a very simple and humble life. He wore old flannel shirts, drove a second hand car, and avoided spending any extra money when he could. The flamboyant spender appears wealthy, but only gives the impression of wealth. Pay off debt, be diligent with payment plans, and don't spend more than you make. This is an easy way to fall into a trap.

2. Do not always follow the herd. Programs like CNBC's "Fast Money" where a panel of traders discusses their quick buys and sells for that day make you believe the only way to make money is to trade in and out. Well, Mr. Read for one reason or another decided to invest in the companies he knew and had a philosophy to invest in stocks that paid dividends. He did this during markets and economies that challenged your sanity and had the majority of people running for shelter. Keep in mind that the payment of dividends is not guaranteed. Companies may reduce or eliminate the payment of dividends at any given time. We do not know when or how he started investing. A couple of the companies fell on hard times. One company went bankrupt and reorganized under a new symbol. Stay consistent with a strategy and don't follow the herd when markets get shaky. Think longterm, judging every asset and investment with risk and reward in mind.

3. Be proactive. Always do your research and make sure investments remain viable. Have an understanding of all of your investments and what you are trying to accomplish. Be proactive in the decision making process. Read the reports and ask the questions. Be involved; this is your money.

4. Have an estate plan. Mr. Read donated a large portion of his wealth to two charities at his death. He had worked with an attorney to have a plan for his wealth when he passed away. If he did not give to those charities at his death the headline could have read, "Man amasses \$8 million estate and gives Uncle Sam over a million in estate taxes." Stay in control of your assets. Having the appropriate estate planning done can help you leave more assets to your heirs than to the government.

5. Wealth can be earned, regardless of circumstances. Let's look at a hypothetical example of how it may be possible to accumulate \$8 million by age 65. A 40-year-old with a net worth of \$1 million that has the ability to invest \$70,000 per year at a 6% average return will have \$8.1 million at age 65. Notice I said net worth. This is everything that can be liquidated minus your debts. The key is to have appreciation on those assets. Have a plan and stick to it. This is a hypothetical example and is not representative of any specific situation. Your results will vary. Increasing your wealth does not have to come from luck or circumstances, but may be earned with hard work, discipline, and a good long-term plan.

The Overall Goal of Improving Dentistry in Our State

I would like to introduce myself as the new president of the Louisiana State Board of Dentistry. I graduated from LSU Dental School in 1984 and have been practicing general dentistry in Marrero, on the west bank of the Mississippi across from New Orleans, since graduation. I have been on and off the Board since 1996. My term on the Board, like my presidency, expires at

the end of this year. At that time, I will retire from the Board for good. It is and has been an honor and a privilege to serve the people of Louisiana and my chosen profession. The profession of dentistry is one for which I have a great deal of love and, although my time on the Board will be over at the end of this year, I intend to continue to be involved in efforts to improve the field.

I look forward to a great year as president. However, there will be challenges ahead. I believe that through a new era of cooperation between the Board and the LDA, all of dentistry will benefit. Among the things on the horizon with the Board are changes to the anesthesia rules. The prior board president, Dr. Wilton Guillory, mentioned the proposed changes in his last letter in the LDA Journal. The proposed rules have been provided to the LDA so that the LDA House of Delegates can review them in April of this year, prior to their adoption. The proposed changes basically increase the education required to receive a sedation/ anesthesia permit to fall in line with the ADA guidelines. Dentists who already have permits will not be required to receive additional training. However, all dentists who hold a sedation/anesthesia permit will, under the proposed rules, be required to get six hours of continuing education on sedation every two years. This is not in addition to their biennial 40 hours of continuing education. Instead, six hours of the required 40 hours must deal with



sedation. The Board anticipates voting on the rules at its May meeting, and thereafter it would be several months before they would go into effect.

Another thing that I would like to mention is internet advertising. Many of you might be surprised by which search terms will bring up your name in an internet search, and by how you are listed in the search results. An online search of the yellow

pages or white pages for "endodontists in [any particular city in Louisiana]" will bring up lists which include many dentists who are not endodontists. The lists will frequently even list non-endodontists as endodontists. The Board realizes that when dentists sign up for these online advertising services they are frequently placed in categories that they did not request. Accordingly, the Board has, for now, been making allowances for these situations. However, I urge all of the dentists in this state to do internet searches for various specialties in their area to make sure that they are being correctly listed by the advertisers that they have retained.

In closing, I am hopeful that we are on the brink of a new era of cooperation between the Board and the LDA. Although the stated goals of the two entities are different, one to protect the public and one to advocate for dentists, the overall goal for both is to improve dentistry in this state in general. In improving dentistry, both goals are met. In working alongside each other, rather than in opposition to each other, we can achieve the common goal and benefit all of the citizens of this state.



Slow and Steady Wins the Race

The mission of a dental school is multifaceted and complex. On the surface, the goal is straightforward, i.e., to educate dental professionals to care for our citizens. However, a myriad of issues and challenges are involved in accomplishing this goal. Effective classroom and clinical training, faculty recruitment and retention, a strong patient base, promoting and strengthening faculty research, and adequate facilities are all required for success.

To that end, members of the faculty and staff must focus on both short- and long-term objectives through planning and progress evaluation. The process is not static, but fluid—shifting and evolving to address funding challenges, technological advances, and improved ways of delivering education and patient care.

Concentration on key areas continues through our planning process. Our current strategic plan focuses on five goals: establish and maintain a contemporary curriculum; enhance efforts in recruitment, development, and retention of outstanding faculty and staff; foster enhanced excellence in scholarship and research; secure and maintain adequate resources to sustain and enhance the mission; and improve the physical environment.

This ongoing process also ensures that we are prepared for the accreditation site visit, which occurs every seven years. Consultants appointed by the Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA) will visit LSUSD in 2016 to assess its programs in education, research, and patient care. To prepare, faculty and staff are gathering and analyzing data to ensure that CODA standards are met in all the aforementioned areas. Although an arduous endeavor, it ensures that we continue to deliver the best possible education for our students and offer the best possible care for our patients. Following the previous visit in 2009, the school received an exceptional report and we expect an equally positive report for the upcoming accreditation visit. A major focus in recent years has been to ensure that our educational and clinical facilities are adequate and up-to-date. I am pleased to report that much has been accomplished. Among the most noteworthy are:

- A new patient screening clinic at the school to streamline and expedite patient screening for both students and faculty. Complete with six clinical chairs and two surgery suites, the clinic was generously funded by Nobel Biocare and our alumni through the Committee of 100 Fund.
- A new general practice residency clinic in Baton Rouge. With more than double the space of the previous facility, the new clinic can accommodate more patients and includes six operatories, a consultation, a radiology room with a panoramic unit, a laboratory, and a teleconference room.
- A \$450,000 gift from the LSU Health Foundation to establish a healthcare clinic on LSUSD grounds. The clinic is a joint effort between the schools of dentistry and nursing. Its purpose is two-fold: to care for the underserved population in the New Orleans Mid-City area and to teach students how to work effectively with other health professionals to improve health care outcomes for patients and the community.
- Architectural plans for the new preclinical labs are complete. The leadership of the LSU Health Sciences Center is solidly behind the project and our fundraising efforts continue to raise the \$8.1 million needed for the lab renovations.

These improvements directly affect our ability to provide better clinical training for students and improved care for patients. They also provide additional streams of revenue to address budget shortfalls.

Other areas of concentration include outreach to the underserved and student recruitment.

This past fiscal year LSUSD faculty and students sponsored 28 outreach efforts benefiting nearly 1,400

individuals. Screenings, the placement of dental sealants, oral cancer exams, and oral health education were among the services we provided. In February our pediatric dentistry department coordinated the school's 7th annual Give Kids a Smile event. Approximately 120 school children from Medard H. Nelson Charter School received dental screenings and oral health education. LSUSD faculty and staff also are vital partners with the Louisiana Dental Association for the annual Louisiana Mission of Mercy outreach. In addition, with the assistance of our alumni, the school has established a committee to address dental shortages in rural areas.

The Pre-Dental 101 Workshop continues to attract a great deal of interest among college students. A joint program of LSUSD and the LSU Pre-Dental Society, this year's event attracted over 300 participants from seven different states. Dr. Toby Cheramie, assistant dean of admissions, also visits colleges in Louisiana and Arkansas to promote LSUSD educational programs to prospective applicants. Competition for admission continues to be strong in both dentistry and dental hygiene.

Focus, consistency, and flexibility are all necessary to sustain and enhance the LSUSD mission. It requires the support and input of our faculty, staff, students, and alumni. We are fortunate to have such a close community of committed individuals who care about the school. It doesn't happen overnight, but our progress is evident. Slow and steady wins the race.


